Meditate on the following passages to appreciate the authority, purpose and value of the Scriptures:

2 Timothy 3.16

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness

Hebrews 4.12

For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any doubleedged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart.

Psalm 19.7-11

The law of the Lord is perfect, refreshing the soul. The statutes of the Lord are trustworthy, making wise the simple. The precepts of the Lord are right, giving joy to the heart. The commands of the Lord are radiant, giving light to the eyes. The fear of the Lord is pure, enduring forever. The decrees of the Lord are firm, and all of them are righteous. They are more precious than gold, than much pure gold; they are sweeter than honey, than honey from the honeycomb. By them your servant is warned; in keeping them there is great reward.



Mark is a good book to start with if Bible reading is a new experience. If you are mentoring or leading a Bible study, it is a good practice to prepare some simple questions that will help the mentee observe and interpret the passage and apply it to their life.
