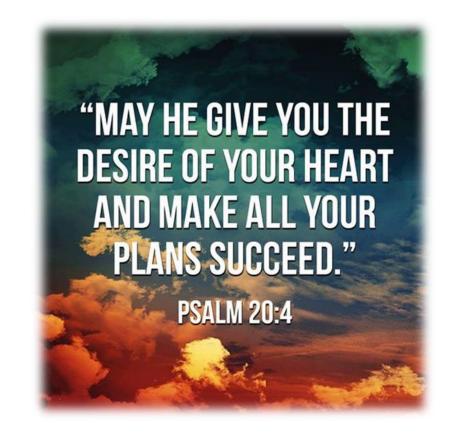


Psalm 20

- ⁷ Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the Lord our God.
- ⁸ They are brought to their knees and fall, but we rise up and stand firm.
- ⁹ Lord, give victory to the king! Answer us when we call!
