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Commonly Asked Questions

1. What is the role of Core Group in the CARE Group?

Core Group members are selected CG members who are committed to serve with the CGL / ACGL to lead the CG. While each of the Core Group members may take on specific roles (For example, member's birthday IC, missions ministry report / prayer letter, etc.), their key role is to lead and facilitate care and discipleship in the CG.

Every Core Group member follows-up with 1-3 CG members. The Core Group meets once every two months to evaluate, share and plan for the CG.



2. Is disciple-making (or mentoring) only done through the Core Group members?

Discipleship is best facilitated in small groups and be accountable to CG leaders, therefore, disciple-making in CG is done through the Core Group members.

However, this does not restrict any members to having more than one disciplers in their lives, e.g. other worshippers, believers from other churches, etc.

3. How does CG facilitate G.S.R.R.?

C+GSRR is our Church's **Discipleship Pathway**. The primary purpose of CG is the mission of Disciple-making. Therefore, the CG is committed to journeying with every CG member in the Discipleship pathway.

- Connect The CG facilitates Connect with Christ through mutual encouragement and Connect to Community through regular meetings, prayer and fellowship.
- Grow The CG facilitates Grow through the studying and applying of God's Word in our lives.
- Serve The CG facilitates Serve by encouraging service in the CG and in Church.
- Reach The CG facilitates Reach by doing
 Community outreach and Missions together. We also partner with one another in our Personal outreach to family, friends and colleagues.
- Reproduce The CG facilitates Reproduce through forming Mentoring Groups within the CG and partnering with one another to make disciples.



4. Why did we transit from life-stage CGs to mixed CGs?

Here are the key benefits of mixed CGs:

- Diverse Wisdom & Perspectives where older members offer life experiences and spiritual maturity, while younger members bring energy and fresh insights. It encourages patience, humility, and learning from others unlike themselves (Romans 14:19).
- Stronger Community & Unity by fostering a more inclusive church body (Galatians 3:28).
- Better Care and Support where varied life stages mean diverse forms of support. For example, singles, married couples, seniors, and youths help each other practically and emotionally.
- Prepares members for real world ministry. Believers
 interact with people of all ages in their daily lives.
 Mixed CGs help believers relate to a broader range of
 people, which develops our empathy and
 adaptability in ministry and sharing the Gospel.

The 2 monthly meeting helps to review our CG meetings (what went well and what can be improved), members' care (who and how we should follow up) and assignment of who should follow up, the planning of quarterly schedule, Community Building, Adoration, Renewal and Engagement, and involving all CG members to lead in worship and tune in. The C.A.R.E. components serve as a good guide to facilitate each CG meeting, and provides good balance of Bible study, prayers, worship and connection with church activities (announcements).
