






Jesus at the Temple – Absence of Worship



Jesus Curses a Fig Tree – Lack of Fruitfulness

"18 Early in the morning, as Jesus was on his way back to the city, he was hungry. 19 Seeing a fig tree by the road, he went up to it but found nothing on it except leaves. Then he said to it, "May you never bear fruit again!" Immediately the tree withered."

The Authority of Jesus Questioned – Spiritual Hypocrisy





"²³Jesus entered the temple courts, and, while he was teaching, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him. "By what authority are you doing these things?" they asked. "And who gave you this authority?"

²⁴Jesus replied, "I will also ask you this question. If you answer me, I will tell you by what authority I am doing these things.

²⁵John's baptism – where did it come from?

Was it from heaven, or from human origin?"

"They discussed it among themselves and said, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will ask, 'Then why didn't you believe him?' ²⁶But if we say, 'Of human origin' – we are afraid of the people, for they all hold that John was a prophet.

²⁷So they answered Jesus, "We don't know."

Then he said, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things."

Jesus' warning to the religious leaders

- 1. Our faith is not about outward religiosity.
- 2. Our faith must bear fruit in love, justice, mercy and prayer
- 3. Our faith is about surrendering to His Lordship.
